

Tuition Fees, Fee Payment & Fee Deferral Information – 2023-2024:

Dear Incoming MPP Class of 2025:

This email is to give you some information regarding tuition fee payments, including deferrals for the 2023-2024 academic year. Your tuition fees will be applied to your ACORN account in mid-July 2023. You cannot pay or defer your fees until this time.

Fee Payment Dates

Mid-July: Tuition fee information will be posted to your [ACORN](#) student account

Friday, September 1: Deadline to pay the minimum tuition fee payment (Fall tuition fees) or the deadline to defer your fees to get registered.

You can pay all the fees up front for the academic year by Friday, September 1, 2023, OR pay fees by term: fall fees by stated deadlines and then winter fees by the stated deadlines.

The table below shows the fee payment deadlines for students with a fee deferral and students without a fee deferral.

How do I ensure my tuition payment is received by the deadline?

It takes 3-5 business days for the funds to register on your ACORN account, so we recommend the following:

Fall 2023 Fees: Pay the Fall 2023 fees by **Friday, August 25**, to ensure the funds reach the University by **Friday, September 1**.

Winter 2024 Fees: Pay the Winter 2024 fees by **Thursday, November 30**, to ensure the funds reach the University before service charges are applied to all outstanding fees on **Friday, December 15**.

Fee Deferral: If you have a fee deferral, we recommend paying the Winter 2024 session fees by **Wednesday, January 31**, to avoid paying service charges. Service charges will be applied beginning **Thursday, February 15**.

Fall 2023 and Winter 2024 fees must be paid in full no later than April 30, 2024

How much are my fees?

Fees for the 2023-2024 academic year have not been posted yet.

What is a Fee Deferral?

A fee deferral allows students to register before paying fees. Fee deferrals are subject to approval. Other Frequently Asked Questions

When will I receive the MPP Fellowship or any other award/bursary offered by the Master of Public Policy?

All MPP fellowships and awards/bursaries are deposited in your ACORN account in mid-October.

I applied for OSAP but haven't received my student loan approval. What do I do?

Access your ACORN account and apply for a fee deferral online based on the amount you requested to OSAP. You can use the amount requested or an estimate.

What happens if I don't pay by the recommended payment date?

*If you do not pay by the date we recommend, the funds might not reach the University in a timely manner. Banks take about five business days to transfer the funds to U of T. As a result, your account will be financially cancelled (FINCA'd). "FINCA" happens when the University does not receive the required payment. Consequently, students are de-registered from all the courses they had registered for. Student accounts are "FINCA'd" on **September 15**. You can avoid this if you process a deferral or pay your fees on time. You will incur service charges on unpaid fees.*

What other financial funding is available?

*The Master of Public Policy Program offers the PMAS bursary. PMAS is a bursary offered to students registered in Professional programs in the Faculty of Arts & Science. This is a financial-need-based non-repayable grant that is **ONLY** awarded to *OSAP* and other provincial student funding program recipients. You do not need to apply for PMAS. If you are an OSAP recipient you will be assessed automatically. The amount of the bursary is based on the report that we receive from the OSAP office. Last year 25% of MPP1 OSAP recipients received some funding. PMAS is disbursed directly to your ACORN account in mid-January.*
